#### NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Based on a survey study conducted among Respiratory Care Practitioners, the Respiratory Care Department at Washington Adventist Hospital has identified a need to educate Respiratory Care Practitioners and other health care professionals on current topics and issues in ventilator management. Topics to be discussed during this Conference will include:

- κ Advances in Mechanical Ventilation κ Difficult Airway
- κ ABG Interpretation/Classification κ Neonatal Weaning
- κ Patient-Ventilator Dys-synchrony
- κ Independent Lung Ventilation (ILV)

#### **OBJECTIVE**

The goal of the conference is to increase knowledge and awareness using diverse perspectives to improve clinical outcomes associated with mechanical ventilation through monitoring techniques and protocols.

#### ACCREDITATION

#### **EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES**

- κ Discuss the rule of noninvasive ventilation in the care of patients with respiratory failure.
- κ Explain how to set tidal volume and PEEP to minimize ventilatorinduced lung injury.
- κ Describe the role of respiratory therapist protocols in the ventilator discontinuation process.

- κ Describe the difference between interpretation classification of ABG's.
- κ Describe the difference between technical and functional classification of ABG's.
- $\kappa$  Explain the role of the ventilator trigger in dys-synchrony.
- κ Discuss approaches to flow dys-synchrony.
- κ Explain how cycle dys-synchrony can occur with pressure support ventilation.
- κ Describe the role of ventilator mode on dys-synchrony.
- κ Identify the patient with a difficult airway. κ Recognize the "auxiliary" techniques of laryngeal intubation. κ Recognize and manage displaced tracheotomy appliances.
- $\kappa$  Describe the benefits of neonatal CPAP.
- κ Recognize the criteria for acceptable CBG's for weaning the neonate from mechanical ventilation.
- $\kappa$  Recognize quickly neonatal respiratory distress and the need to resume mechanical ventilation following extubation
- κ Understand the indications for initiating (ILV) in acute respiratory failure.
- $\kappa$  Review the mechanical applications of (ILV) as a ventilation technique including the use of double lumen tubes, synchronization <u>and modes</u>.
- κ Discuss the complications of (ILV) with emphasis on returning the patient to conventional ventilation.
- κ Understand the laws governing the decision-maker in the event the patient lacks capacity to make medical decisions.
- κ Understand the difficulty in defining the concept of "futile
- κ Understand the role of the respiratory therapist in dealing with families in crisis due to the critical illness of a loved one.
